Dead, Dying, or Dangerous Tree Cutting Permit Application

NOTE: This application is only for trees to be cut or removed that are dead, dying or diseased. Please see Section D.2.d. of the Tree Ordinance for definitions of those terms. Note that additional considerations and conditions may apply for new improvements, subdivisions, or lot development projects. Please see subsection "G." of the City Tree Cutting Ordinance.

PROCESS:

1. The applicant fills out the required information below and submits it to the City Manager.
2. If the tree(s) are in a Water Quality Resource area of Flood Hazard area, requirements in Rivergrove's flood hazard regulations shall be followed, as well as any local, state, or federal flood or water quality regulations.
3. As part of the application process, a Mitigation Plan for the loss of trees on the property shall be required.
4. The City Planning Commission will review the application and will approve or deny it.
5. If the applicant is not satisfied with the Planning Commission decision, it may be appealed to the City Council.

Alder - large, in backyard on riverbank - Dead

Maple - medium, in front yard by driveway - Dying/Dead

8. Information and evidence that support the tree cutting and/or removal(s). Provide information and documentation that the tree(s) are dead, dying, or diseased as noted in Section D.2.d. of the City Tree Ordinance. If the tree is dead, provide a photograph of the tree(s) proposed for removal.

I have contracted with Pacific N.W Arborists to trim the large trees on my property every 5-6 years since moving in. On this last inspection the arborist recommended removal of 2 dead/dying trees. I will attach photos.

MITIGATION PLAN REQUIREMENTS

The application process shall include a Mitigation Plan. During approval deliberations, the number and type of trees to be planted in mitigation for cut or removed trees shall be determined on a case by case basis, depending on each unique site. The City Arborist shall review and comment on the Mitigation Plan before it is approved by the Planning Commission.

The Mitigation Plan must include the following:

1. The species and caliper of mitigation tree(s) are to be planted.
2. A site map showing the location of trees to be removed, the location of trees to be planted, and any proposed development on site.
3. A schedule with the proposed planting date.
4. Identification of measures to be taken to keep the mitigation tree(s) alive during the first five years after planting.
5. A Performance Bond, warranty, or other security acceptable to the City to ensure that all mitigation trees survive for a five-year period after planting. This shall be required only if the value of the mitigation trees and their installation exceeds \$500 in costs.

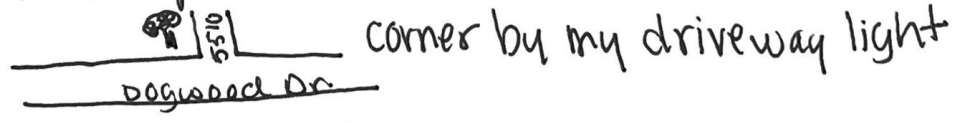

Mitigation Plan:

For front yard maple I already have a vine maple available to plant in it's place. Planting will be early fall.



For backyard the Alder is dead. The plan is to leave the trunk/stump for riverbank stability. Arborist has recommended planting an Oregon Ash along bank, or an alder. Plan is to plant while ^{soil is} still warmer as suggested, October or end of September.
