Hi Jeff,

Parking on public streets is an all-or-nothing proposition in the county. We do not have a permitted parking program, as we just don't have enough streets in dense urban areas to warrant the administrative and enforcement infrastructure to justify such a program. In some cases, residents are allowed to request parking prohibition on their street if 100% of affected property owners sign a petition, but I don't think the residents want that, and I don't think the county or city would support it.

Just FYI, with COVID we have seen unprecedented demand at accesses to area waterways, all over the county. We have gotten many complaints about parking issues at access points that never had issues before. I can't say for certain what will happen as things start to get back to normal, but I would guess that traffic volumes this year may revert to what we've seen in past years prior to the COVID restrictions.
