Planning Commission Business

At its regular meeting on Tuesday, March 3, the Planning Commission approved a Type III Development and tree removal permit for a single family home on Lot 1 of the Chapman Estates Phase 2 Partition (5450 SW Childs Road) and a Type III Development and tree removal permit for a single family home on Lot 2 of the Chapman Estates Phase 2 Partition (5450 SW Childs Road) was approved. The Commission also approved the final plat for Chapman Estates Phase 2.

City Council Business

At its regular meeting on Monday, March 10, the City Council accepted the resignation of City Manager John Leutheuser, then met in executive session to discuss employment. Following the executive session, Council voted to offer the job of City Manager to former mayor Heather Kibbey.

At a special meeting on March 16, 2020, Council passed a resolution appointing Heather Kibbey to the position of City Manager.

The City of Rivergrove is excited to announce that we are launching the first steps toward the all new Rivergrove Land Development Ordinance (RLDO). The City Council has assembled a steering committee to review the first discussion draft of the new version. This is comprised of members of the public, City Council and Planning Commission, plus the new City Manager. After the committee completes it's first draft, this document will be ready for the first hearing before the Planning Commission.
